### Are you/do you...

Interested in how British society operates?

By studying Law you will develop a comprehensive understanding of the role of law in today's society, alongside an awareness of the rights and responsibilities of individuals and how this applies to your life.

### How will you be assessed?

This course takes both the AS and A2 programmes (they link closely). For AS there are two papers each lasting 1 hour 30 minutes. The questions consist of a combination of multiple choice, short answer and extended writing. For A2 there are 3 papers, each lasting 2 hours. Once again the questions consist of a combination of multiple choice, short answer and extended writing.

### What will I study?

- The nature of Law and the English legal system
- Criminal Law
- Tort (negligence)
- Optional unit\* - Human Rights or Contract Law

\* A2 Programme only

### How will this subject support my future plans?

As well as the knowledge specific to the subject of Law, students will develop their analytical ability, decision making, critical thinking and problem-solving skills. All these skills are highly sought after by higher education institutions and employers.

As well as the obvious pathway into a Law degree or Law career, A Level Law students can follow a wide and diverse range of next step option.

### Entry requirements

A minimum of Grade C (or Grade 4 in the reformed subjects) in at least 5 GCSE subjects, including Mathematics. In addition, a minimum of Grade 5 in English Language is required.
