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Well Being Support

Bingley Grammar School has always placed great emphasis on well-being. We know that in order for our children to thrive educationally, they need to feel physically safe and emotionally secure. We recognise that, although we are not a mental health provision, there is a lot we can do to support our students who are experiencing mental health difficulties. Within school, we have the following provision:

- The pastoral staff have different skill sets to help support students, they may offer 6 one to one sessions with young people. However, if it is felt more specific support is needed we make referrals to external agencies.
- Youth in Mind (www.mindinbradford.org.uk) can support 18 students per half term and are in school for 2 days per week - Mental Health Support in Schools (MHST) is provided by the NHS and can support 12 students per half term, they are in school for 2 days per week
- Think for the Future (www.thinkforthefuture.co.uk) partner with schools to provide behaviour & resilience mentoring. They are able to work with 40 students per term for 1 day per week - Peer Mentors provided by the Student Leadership Team
